22 23	H. O'Dwyer explained the improvements: expand the parking lot (85 ft wide & 220 ft
24	long, which will add 40 parking spaces) to include universally accessible pathway, 2 pit toilet restrooms & 2 pavilions. Chris Sullivan is grant writing for us.
25	G. Sauer asked if this was a DNR Grant. Yes.
26	R. Rommell stated that it makes sense to close off Lakeside Blvd to vehicle traffic. With
27	adding 40 spaces, people will be able to park. The Trust Fund Conservancy is writing our grant
28	and we are lucky to have C. Sullivan helping out. They are going to provide more than \$100,000
29	in matching funds.
30	H. O'Dwyer stated that Lakeside Blvd. will be kept open to foot traffic.
31	R. Rommell reminded the council that at the Beach meeting last summer & talked about
32	solutions, the biggest concern was that there be a plan & places to park, not just have it closed.
33	The Grant application for Phase I shows that we are thinking ahead. This is positive.
34	H. O'Dwyer said that the council is wanting to plan to pave the boulevard past the houses.
35	Do one thing at a time.
36	K. Holmes stated that we'll have the road closed for improvements and not have the no
37	trespassing concerns after that.

- H. O'Dwyer read the letter from the Dept. of Army Corp of Engineers regarding the changes for the marina at the Harbor Lights in Frankfort.
- H. O'Dwyer read the letter from Frankfort Elberta Area Schools regarding donations for their graduation party.
- H. O'Dwyer read the Health Department Grant that was awarded to us for \$14,621 for improvements at the Waterfront Park. We'll put up a sign for the donators, and signage for the usage of the equipment. Mulch will be able to be purchased with this grant money. Cost will be about \$9000. R. Rommell stated that we've known for some time that the mulch needed to be replaced. Then it will be a safer place for kids.

19 **Old Business**

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1. Blight - B. Addis reported that she emailed several villages and townships around our area. She has not had any replies.

New Business

- 1. Sewer issues & updates: K. Mlcek updated us on the sewer break. The pipe is under the river. Will be doing a pressure test. Hook up will be Friday. Still on the bypass over the weekend. Valve structures have been added to each end. Given the circumstances, all things have gone well. Elmer's did a great job. Finish up on Monday. Gave an update on potential funding. Reserve account has \$57,000. MI Rural possible \$100,000. Bond Attorney for other options. H. O'Dwyer is hoping we can get a loan and we are eligible for grants. We will televise to see the condition of the pipes. B. Soper asked anticipated cost? K. Mlcek said between \$60,000 and \$100,000. B. Addis reported that SOS Analytical did the *E. coli* testing and the results were at a low level. K. Mlcek stated that the pump improvements were on hold until we see where the dust settles.
- **2.** Northern A-1 Services: Motion by K. Holmes, seconded by B. Soper, to accept the proposal by Northern A-1 Services and have H. O'Dwyer sign it. Roll Call: All Ayes. Motion Carried.
- 3. Delinquent Water Bills: J. Gatrell understands that there are some trailer park residents that haven't paid their water bills. She wants residents with past due bills to pay their bills or shut off the water. Discussion about moving the shut-off valves in a different place not under trailers at the trailer park. As a safety issue, council doesn't want DPW Superintendent to crawl under trailers to turn off water. B. Addis said she could give a copy of the list of shut-off notices to council members so they are aware of who is on the list.
- **4.** Budget Amendments:

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- a. Elberta Beach: Grant wants to see how we will maintain the Beach and see that it is in our budget. The amendment shows that money is moved from one area (Waterfront Park) to separate out to a new dept (753) Elberta Beach. Will need to send to C. Sullivan the Maintenance Plan. Motion by K. Holmes, seconded by B. Soper, to separate the finances for the Elberta Beach for the proposed budget amendment. Roll Call: All Ayes. Motion Carried.
 - b. Sewer Fund: Motion by K. Holmes, seconded by J. Gatrell, to amend the budget to include paying back the sewer loan: principal \$5,000 and interest \$2,703.75. Ayes: Gatrell, Holmes, Soper, O'Dwyer. Motion Carried.
 - 5. MNRTF Grant & Resolution #2018-005: R. Rommell read Resolution #2018-005. Motion by K. Holmes, seconded by B. Soper, to adopt Resolution #2018-005 for the Application to the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund. Roll Call: Ayes: Gatrell, Holmes, Soper, O'Dwyer. Motion Carried.
 - 6. Water Rate Study: H. O'Dwyer read from the report that the rates would go up 24%. K. Holmes added that for the bond we needed to keep up with the rise in rates. Motion by B. Soper, seconded by K. Holmes, to accept the Water Rate Study and to follow it. Roll Call: Ayes: Gatrell, Holmes, Soper, O'Dwyer. Motion Carried.
 - 7. New Water Reading System: Quote by SLC Meter LLC for \$15,150 for a new system. Ours is outdated and we need new software and laptop. R. Rommell from the Budgeting point of view; the Water Fund shows a net of \$19,000, so it could come out of repairs/maintenance for improvements. B. Addis was instructed to add \$15,150 to Repairs/Maintenance line item in the budget. Motion by B. Soper, seconded by K. Holmes, to approve the purchase of the new Water Reading System. Roll Call: Ayes: Gatrell, Holmes, Soper, O'Dwyer. Motion Carried.
