19		Members received copies of a draft Village of Elberta Mobile Food Unit Licensing Ordinance and draft
20		Village of Elberta Ordinance to Amend the Elberta Zoning Ordinance (pertaining to mobile food units),
21		both prepared by Village attorney Bryan Graham. Members also received copies of mobile food
22		ordinances and permit applications from Frankfort and Traverse City.

25		Village of Elberta Mobile Food Unit Licensing Ordinance Draft The joint PC/Council group went
26	••	through the document from beginning to end and discussed various points: under Section 3 License
27		Required, chg "Village Clerk" to "Village Clerk/Treasurer or Deputy Clerk"; Section 4 Application and Fee
28		Requirements, addition that the fee applies to the calendar year, is nontransferable, and "there shall be
29		no proration of fees"; no fee required of food trucks operated by a food/beverage business on the
30		village tax rolls and located on the property of that business (permit/license still required); clarifying
31		rules hours/days of operation (needs more discussion when fee schedule is created; may vary by
32		location [example Penfold when Farmers Mkt is in session] or if unit falls under festival policy/special
33		events) "mobile vending units used during Farmers Mkt and Festivals are subject to those rules/policies"
34 25		(consensus seemed to be a general window of 7 am to 10 pm); need clarification from atty on (e) "if
35 36		employed by another person"; (l) fingerprints on file: need clarification; Section 5 Investigation: chg "may be denied" to "shall be denied"? ask atty; Section 6 Standards for Approval: language should
30 37		indicate that MFUs should be "parked only in designated areas of parking lots and parks, and private
38		property in allowed districts (per zoning)," not local streets; permit/application should include map
39		indicating spots; power use: add language regarding use of electrical power, cords, generators (specific
40		questions for permit see TC application) pollution, noise, trip hazards, and power theft concerns;
41		discussed specifying places where MFUs should *not* be parked: for now, beach parking lot and
42		turnaround; Section 7 "for the period of one (1) calendar year, is nontransferable, and there will be no
43		proration of fees," and no discount for renewal fee; discussed adding too-bright lights to Section 8 (b);
44		Section 9, exemptions: discussed youth vending (Frankfort regulates this) and lemonade stands (does
45		not apply in our ordinance because not MFUs); set limit of 10 licenses per year including both private
46		and public property (not including festivals and farmers market; planned community of food trucks);

1 MFU, no more than 3 ft high and 8 sq ft.; number of chairs, tables, parking spaces required/limited, not 2 subject to setbacks if there's an existing parking lot that exceeds the setbacks (/is nonconforming)— 3 need language from atty.

5 **Extended General Public Comment** A limit of 5 min per person was set. Jim Barnes: make sure employee 6 operating MFU has authorization from employer; 7 am good start time, 10 pm may be too early for after bar 7 crowd; specify leaseholder of property not owner w/r/t food service business fee waiver; nice not to have to 8 depart, can MFUs stay parked; a lot but not all MFUs have generators for electricity to run POS, lights, etc., noise 9 is potential issue; designate spaces within allowed areas; Frankfort forbids MFUs at beach, try it at Elberta Beach 10 with designated spots; specify rules for lights; Ryan King: opposed to food trucks as detrimental to existing food 11 svc businesses; comments stopped with 43 seconds left due to profane, ad hominem, inflammatory, and 12 irrelevant content
