WHEREAS the Village of Elberta has posted ads for the Deputy Clerk/Administrative Assistant and the Clerk-Treasurer position in the <i>Record-Patriot</i> , the Village website, the Community Building bulletin board, and Village Post Office, and
WHEREAS Interviews were held by an interview team consisting of two members of Council, two village residents and a former village clerk, a qualified applicant was chosen, offered the Clerk-Treasurer Appointed Official Salaried Position, accepted the offer on July 24, 2023, and was appointed to the Clerk-Treasurer Position on July 31, 2023,
NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the newly Appointed Clerk-Treasurer, Katherine Ralston, shall receive a General Fund supported Wage and Compensation Salary package equivalent to \$23 an hour, 40 hours a week, plus a monthly Health Insurance Stipend of \$500 for the remainder of the 2023–2024 Fiscal Year.
