To: The Honorary Village President and Members of the Village of Elberta Board Re: Frankfort Fire & Emergency Services February Report.

- I. Here are some of the Highlights from February
 - 1. Membership
 - a. We currently have 21 members, 3 Fill-ins, and 4 Cadets.
 - 2. Village of Elberta February Calls

Attached is a breakdown of the calls we received.

- 3. Frankfort Fire & Emergency Services responded to a total of 35 EMS Calls and 15 Fire Calls
 - The average response time was 8 minutes for EMS and 12 minutes for Fire
 - The average turnout for fire calls was 10 members.
 - We averaged about 1.79 calls per day in February.

II. Equipment

- a. 4-Medical
 - The windshield washer pump covering the front and rear windows quit working.
 Since the vehicle was still under warranty, it was repaired on Friday, February 28, 2025.
- b. 4-Brush-2
 - i. This truck is now parked here at the Lake Township Station.
 - A battery tender was purchased and placed on it to maintain a trickle charge.
 - ii. The truck will be taken to Frankfort sometime this month to get the exhaust system replaced.
- c. 4-Brush-1
 - i. Once the ice is off the lakes, we will transition it back to a brush truck.

III. Training

- a. Ice Water Rescue training with the Coast Guard and Benzonia Station 5 at Loon Lake on Sunday, February 16th.
- b. Training Operations in Small Departments a National Fire Academy (off-campus course) was attended on February 22nd & 23rd.
- c. MiOSHA Annual Required Training was conducted on Tuesday, February 25th.

IV. What the Village of Elberta Needs to Know

- c. As part of a countywide cooperative plan, the Frankfort Fire Department, Benzonia Township Fire Department, and Rebecca from Emergency Management will be touring the Graceland Fruit plant on Monday, April 14th at 6:00 PM as part of a comprehensive pre-plan.

V. Community Risk Reduction (CCR) / Safety Message

- a. Generator Safety Many people have generators. As we enter the stormy season, please check to make sure any debris surrounding your generator is cleared to avoid Carbon Monoxide hazards and never run a generator indoors.
- b. Electrical Safety.
- c. Carbon Monoxide When we've received calls for CO detector alarms two common problems were found. First, the furnace filter was dirty. Second, the exhaust pipe on the side of the house was blocked with snow and ice and needed to be cleared.

 - ii. The Advisory Board members asked about the possibility of a BLS ambulance in Frankfort covering priority 3 calls to Paul Oliver and to be available when Benzie EMS was out on transfers instead of calling Thompsonville, Glen Lake, or Green Lake.
